Let's face it. Relationships are hard. And a dating relationship? It's like a long division problem you have to solve by hand. One wrong calculation and you're not coming up with the right answer. My Dating Life Before I Read That Book

Truth is, I didn't date at all in high school. It never comes as a shocker when I share this at live events, where people can see what I look like. In this one respect, I am incredibly Christlike, as Jesus had, "no beauty that we should desire him" (Isaiah 53:2b ESV).

But the reasons behind my high school datelessness weren't solely due to my appearance or my social awkwardness. I also held high standards. And not just about a girl's looks, but about her love for Jesus.

By my teens, I had already developed a relationship with God that was intensely real to me, and I had little interest in dating a girl who couldn't relate to my passion for Jesus. You might think, "Bummer for them," but I was a fun date. I could be funny too, and I liked to be creative. In fact, my dating life included a red convertible Cadillac with a car phone (before there were cell phones), a private plane flight, a secret agent adventure across campus videoed live (back when video cameras sat on your shoulder instead of in your pocket), a candlelit dinner at McDonald's, and a moonlit picnic on the 50-yard line of my college stadium (until gunmen ran us out).

And something else to be said from looking at these topics from the perspective of 29 years of marriage and 25 years of parenting.

All of that said, I don't want you to just follow a set of principles. I want you to follow a *person*: Jesus Christ.
